Continuum of Care Program Request for Proposals for New Projects**

Broward County Board of County Commissioners announces a Request for Proposals (RFP) in response to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) FY 2025 Continuum of Care Program (CoC) Competition and Youth Homeless Demonstration Program (YHDP) Grants Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for New Projects providing homeless assistance programs in Broward County. Agencies eligible to apply for the advertised service are non-profit organizations and public entities. Individuals and for-profit entities are not eligible to apply. Only proposals addressing the advertised service are eligible for funding consideration. The anticipated term for the advertised service is twelve to sixty months, with an initial start date of May 1, 2026 through December 31, 2027.

## **HUD FY 2025 CoC NOFO**

The HUD FY 2025 CoC NOFO (NOFO) targets efforts within Broward County to address and reduce homelessness by offering transitional housing, supportive services only, permanent housing including permanent supportive housing and rapid re-housing. The NOFO is different than in prior years in many important aspects. Agencies must familiarize themselves with these changes, which include, but are not limited to, that Applicants may apply for transitional housing and supportive services only projects, including street outreach. The NOFO emphasizes the reallocation of permanent supportive housing funds to create transitional housing programs with the goal of improving health and long-term economic independence for the homeless. Priority will be given to new projects that provide treatment and services focused on recovery and allowing clients to regain self-sufficiency. The new projects can include on-site behavioral health treatment, robust wraparound supportive services that promote returning to work and increasing income for non-seniors and utilizing the full array of mainstream programs and local and private resources to provide housing and healthcare needed to maintain safe and stable housing while imposing participation requirements. For permanent supportive housing, the NOFO prioritizes elderly individuals and / or individuals with a physical disability or impairment or developmental disability not including substance use disorder. CoCs are encouraged to work with law enforcement, first responders, and their state and local governments to reduce encampments, public camping, and public drug use to address barriers to maintaining housing and increasing self-sufficiency.

Applicants must review the NOFO to ensure they meet all of HUD's requirements contained within the NOFO. The NOFO is located at <https://www.grants.gov/search-results-detail/360861>. The breakdown of funding will be outlined in the local RFP.

**The funds listed in the local RFP are estimates and are contingent upon the funding award from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.** Broward County is not obligated to award contracts for this opportunity.
