Continuum of Care Program Request for Proposals for New Projects**

Broward County Board of County Commissioners announces a Request for Proposals (RFP) in response to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) FY 2026 Continuum of Care Program (CoC) Competition and Youth Homeless Demonstration Program (YHDP) Grants Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for New Projects providing homeless assistance programs in Broward County. Agencies eligible to apply for the advertised service are non-profit organizations and public entities. Individuals and for-profit entities are not eligible to apply. Only proposals addressing the advertised service are eligible for funding consideration. The anticipated term for the advertised service is twelve to sixty months, with an initial start date of January 1, 2027, through December 31, 2027.

HUD FY 2026 CoC NOFO

The HUD FY 2026 CoC NOFO (NOFO) targets efforts within Broward County to address and reduce homelessness by offering transitional housing, supportive services only, and permanent housing. **The NOFO is different than in prior years in many important aspects. Agencies must familiarize themselves with these changes**, which include, but are not limited to, that Applicants may apply for transitional housing and supportive services only projects including street outreach. The NOFO prioritizes projects that promote treatment, economic independence, and which emphasize law and order. Priority will be given to new projects that provide treatment and services focused on recovery and allowing clients to regain self-sufficiency, which has been redefined in the NOFO as the ability to meet basic needs, including a place to live, without public or private assistance. The new projects can include on-site behavioral health treatment, robust wraparound supportive services that promote returning to work and increasing income for non-seniors and utilizing the full array of mainstream programs and local and private resources to provide housing and healthcare needed to maintain safe and stable housing while adding participation requirements through the use of Participation Agreements between the provider and participant. For permanent supportive housing, the NOFO prioritizes elderly individuals and / or individuals with a physical disability or impairment or developmental disability. CoCs are encouraged to work with law enforcement, first responders, and their state and local governments to reduce encampments, public camping, and public drug use to address barriers to maintaining housing and increasing self-sufficiency. Applicants may also apply for new projects pursuant to the CoC Bonus or DV Bonus.

Applicants must review the NOFO to ensure they meet all of HUD's requirements contained within the NOFO. The NOFO is located at [Opportunity Listing - FY 2026 Continuum of Care Competition and Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program Grants NOFO](#) The breakdown of funding will be outlined in the local RFP.

The funds listed in the local RFP are estimates and are contingent upon the funding award from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Broward County is not obligated to award contracts for this opportunity. More detailed information regarding the eligibility criteria and services may be found in the RFP.
