2026 Continuum of Care Program Competition for Homeless Assistance
Request for Renewal Letters of Interest

In response to the U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) 2026 Continuum of Care (CoC) Program Competition and Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program (YHDP) Grants Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO), Broward County Human Services Department is requesting Renewal Letters of Interest (RLOI) for the HUD annual CoC Program to provide homeless assistance services.

ALL AGENCIES WITH EXISTING HUD PROJECTS (Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH), Rapid Re-Housing (RRH), Transitional Housing (TH), and Supportive Services Only (SSO)) **MUST SUBMIT A RENEWAL LETTER OF INTEREST (RLOI) TO RENEW ITS PROJECT(S) FOR THE 2026 HUD COC PROGRAM AWARD YEAR.** Agencies must submit this letter to the County to be considered for inclusion in the County's HUD 2026 CoC Program Competition and YHDP Grants NOFO Collaborative Application.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS: Only agencies with an existing HUD CoC Program agreement to provide homeless services under federal statute *24 CFR Part 578* are eligible to submit a RLOI.

The HUD CoC Program letters of interest are limited to **two pages**. Each letter must be printed on the submitting Agency's letterhead stationery and include all the following bulleted points to be eligible to participate in the next stage of the County's application:

- Applicant agency legal name.
- Agency contact person's name (person coordinating project application).
- Agency contact's telephone number and e-mail address.
- Identify eligible activities of interest (i.e., PSH, RRH, TH, SSO).
- Identify the dollar amount for the renewal project.
- Brief description must include an explanation of the project, in addition to any other eligible proposed components and information, if applicable.
- If agency is requesting an expansion/ /transition of the renewal project, this must be part of the RLOI letter. Please provide the requested amount needed for an expansion/ /transition and a description of the expansion and justification as to reason the expansion is being requested.

NOTE: Projects must review HUD's NOFO requirements and Threshold Criteria, Renewal Project Threshold Criteria and Rating Factors found in Chapter V. Application Review Information of HUD's published NOFO, located at <https://www.grants.gov/search-results-detail/361999>. Agencies applying for expansion/transition will be required to submit their renewal projects and the expansion/transition as a new project in e-Snaps.

Letters not containing all the **mandatory** criteria mentioned above or e-mails with information not submitted in accordance with the above guidelines will not be considered for further funding.

Letters of Interest for renewal project(s) must be submitted to HSDProposals@broward.org no later than Monday, June 22, 2026, at 11:59 P.M.

Late submission of RLOI is a fatal flaw. Late letters will not be accepted or reviewed for consideration during this process. Failure to receive notification from staff is not subject to appeal. The County reserves the right to accept or reject all letters of interest, to waive technicalities or

irregularities, and to accept letters that are in the best interest of the County. The County also reserves the right to modify deadline dates.

Applicant agencies will be notified by e-mail regarding the next step in the HUD CoC Program renewal process.

The County will be announcing the release of the local HUD 2026 CoC Program Competition & YDP Grants NOFO Request for Proposals for New, Bonus, and Domestic Violence Projects according to the Collaborative Application timeline, located at <https://webapps.broward.org/communitypartnershipsrfp/Login.aspx>.

The Public Notice reflects the guidelines of the Homeless Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing: Homeless Continuum of Care Program Rules 24 CFR Part 578 as published in the Federal Register on July 31, 2012, and effective on August 30, 2012; and Homeless Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing: Defines "Chronically Homeless" as published in the Federal Register on December 4, 2015, and effective on January 15, 2015.
