Boating Safety Zones

- Idle Speed, No Wake
- Slow Speed, Minimum Wake
- Slow Speed, Minimum Wake: Sat, Sun & Holidays

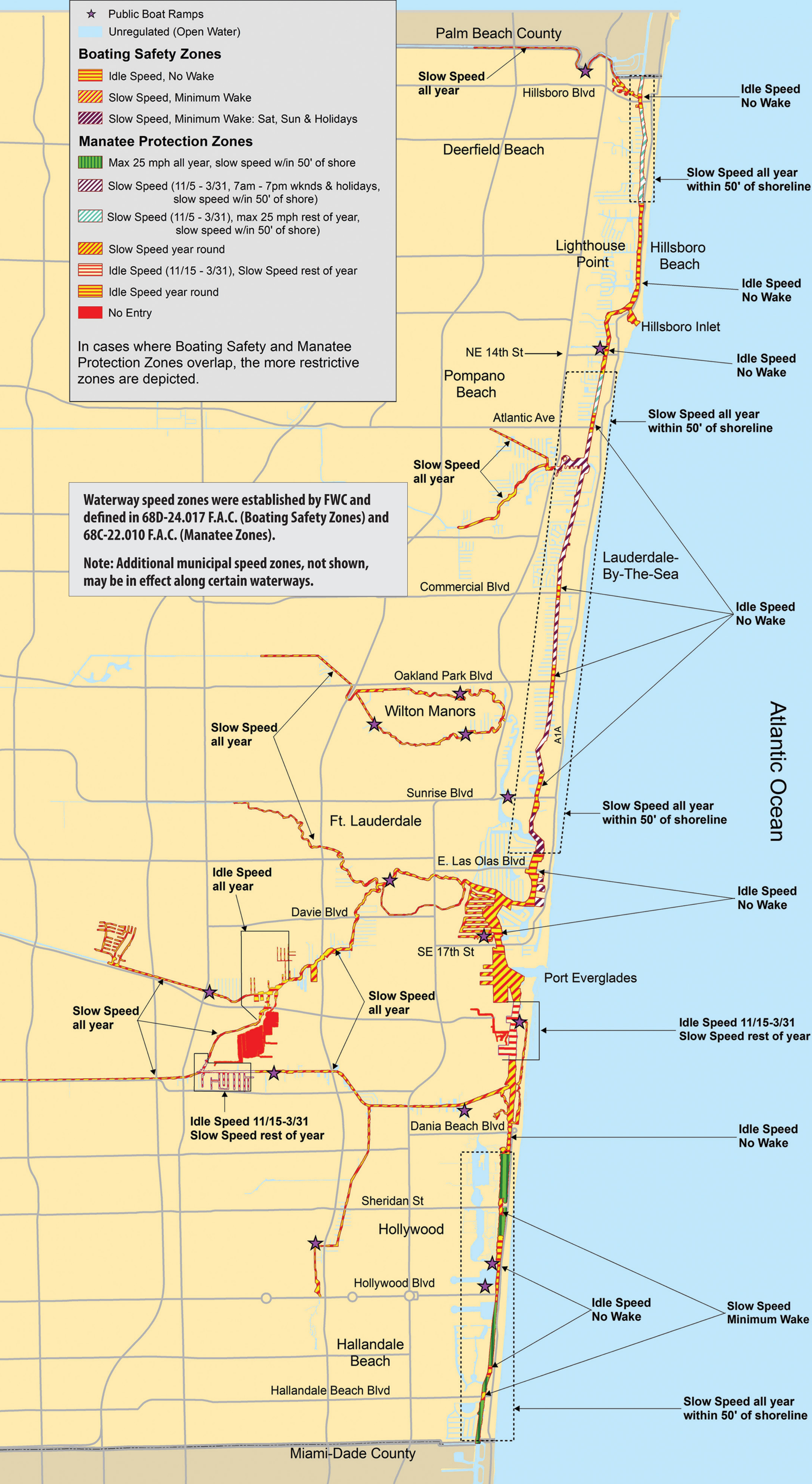
Manatee Protection Zones

- Max 25 mph all year, slow speed w/in 50' of shore
- Slow Speed (11/5 - 3/31, 7am - 7pm wknds & holidays, slow speed w/in 50' of shore)
- Slow Speed (11/5 - 3/31), max 25 mph rest of year, slow speed w/in 50' of shore
- Slow Speed year round
- Idle Speed (11/15 - 3/31), Slow Speed rest of year
- Idle Speed year round
- No Entry

In cases where Boating Safety and Manatee Protection Zones overlap, the more restrictive zones are depicted.

Waterway speed zones were established by FWC and defined in 68D-24.017 F.A.C. (Boating Safety Zones) and 68C-22.010 F.A.C. (Manatee Zones).

Note: Additional municipal speed zones, not shown, may be in effect along certain waterways.

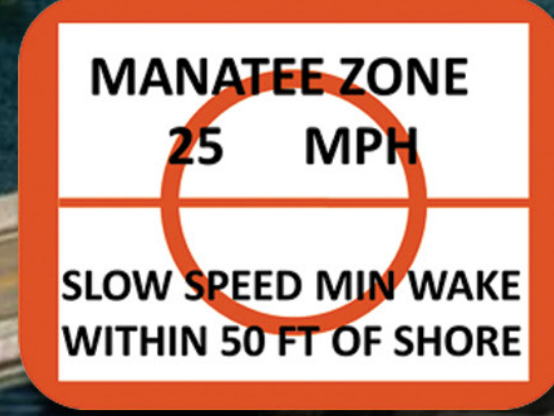
Lowest Speed Needed to Maintain Steerage

Maximum Speed in Channel 25 MPH, Boat or Vessel Settled in Water Near Shore
 Máxima velocidad de 25 MPH Embarcación estable cerca de orilla

ABOUT MANATEES



- ◆ They are aquatic plant-eating mammals, often found on or just below the surface of the water.
- ◆ Manatees are found throughout South Florida's waterways. Winter populations in Broward can reach over 1,000 animals.
- ◆ Manatees have no natural enemies and can live 60 years or more.
- ◆ Manatees have one calf every 2-5 years and the calf remains with the mother for 1-2 years.
- ◆ Manatees are a listed species on the Endangered Species Act by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.
- ◆ Call 1-888-404-FWCC (3922), #FWC, or *FWC on your cellular phone, or use VHF Channel 16 on your marine radio if you see a manatee being harassed or one that is injured or dead.
